For the reasons stated therein, the Miscellaneous Application for exemption is allowed, subject to just exceptions.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is an aspirant for the post of Sub-Inspector in Delhi Police and the Central Armed Police Forces through the Examination-2024

conducted by the Staff Selection Commission (SSC). He is eligible, has applied, appeared in Paper-I of the said examination, and has been provisionally selected.

3. The applicant was thereafter required to undergo the Physical Endurance Test and Physical Height Measurement Test, wherein his height was recorded as 169.5 cm, while the minimum requirement is 170 cm. Subsequently, the applicant approached Lady Hardinge Medical College and Hospital, where his height was measured as 171 cm.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that, since there is a contradictory assessment by a government hospital regarding the applicant's height, he deserves an opportunity to participate in the next stage of the selection process. He further submits that Paper-II of the examination is scheduled to be conducted on 08.03.2025, and if the applicant is not permitted to appear provisionally, the Original Application may be rendered infructuous.

5. Heard.

6. Issue notice.

7. Upon considering the submissions made by learned counsel for the applicant and taking into account that a government hospital, namely Lady Hardinge Medical College and Hospital, has recorded the applicant's height as 171 cm, the balance of convenience lies in favor of the applicant. Additionally, irreparable loss and injury may be caused to him if he is not allowed to appear in the upcoming examination.

8. Accordingly, the respondents are directed to permit the applicant to appear provisionally in Paper-II of the examination scheduled for 08.03.2025, subject to the final outcome of the present Original Application.

9. List the matter on 23.04.2025. **Order Dasti.**
